

very special place and importance in the Kingdom of God; just read the accounts of Jeremiah (1:6-10), Eli (1 Samuel 3:1-19), or Paul's words to Timothy (1 Timothy 4:12-14).

Here at Bethel, we want to uphold these biblical stories and examples, making it clear children and youth are always **welcome**, **wanted**, and **needed**. Not just at youth events, but in all of our congregational life. The old adage from years ago, "Children are to be seen, not heard" is not at all what the scriptures teach, nor what we believe here.

We need to not only see, but also hear from our young people as we worship together (and their helping with ushering, acolyting, reading, music, etc) as we serve together (Feed My Starving Children, teaching VBS, summer mission trips, etc) and reaching out together as we invite others into our faith and congregational life.

We also need the input and ideas of our young people with our committees, and on our Church Council. (More and more of our high school youth are serving in these type of positions.) Youth are not "second class citizens" in the church because of their age. Youth are not simply "the church of tomorrow." Youth are a crucial part of the church today! Ours is not a healthy or balanced family of faith without them having a voice and playing active roles.

Friends, children and young people are some of our greatest gifts from God, and some of our most valuable resources with all their: energy, enthusiasm, idealism, courage, questions, insight and sense of adventure. So let us continue to encourage our young people in every way we can...affirm them, invest in them, and learn from them! Most of all let us pray for them. These are certainly difficult and challenging days to be a child or young person, so perhaps our youth need our prayers more than ever! They need to know we are with them, for them, and thankful to God for them. May God continue to shape, polish and shine these "newly cut diamonds" entrusted to us here at Bethel.

FRIENDSHIP LUNCHEON





500TH ANNIVERSARY

Did you know, October 31, 2017 marks the 500th Anniversary of Luther's Protestant Reformation? Martin Luther was born in Eisleben, Germany, in 1483, and went on to become one of Western history's most significant figures. Luther spent his early years in relative anonymity as a monk and scholar. But in 1517 Luther penned a document attacking the Catholic Church's corrupt practice of selling "indulgences" to absolve sin. His "95 Theses," which set forth two central beliefs—that the Bible is the central religious authority and that humans may reach salvation only by their faith and not by their deeds—was to spark the Protestant Reformation.

In the coming months, you will hear more about Martin Luther, his beliefs, his practices and how they impact and guide what we do at Bethel. Watch for opportunities to learn more and grow in your knowledge of this significant, historic event.

- 3. Provide snacks for those who donate blood.



The last day of preschool is June 8! The K Prep kids will have their graduation/spring program on June 8 at 1pm.


